



## WILDLIFE FRIENDLY SKIES AND SEAS PROGRAM

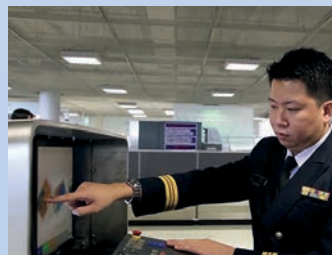


Reducing the illegal trade of endangered and protected species means closing down the supply lines, as much of the wildlife sold around the world travels on commercial flights, or comes through major shipping ports. This includes both the legal and illegal trade that makes it especially difficult to determine which is which. Packed into crates or suitcases without sufficient food, air or water, the creatures suffer great hardships; many are dead on arrival.

Providing everyone from law enforcement officials to airline ground staff and flight crews with the proper training to pinpoint such crimes-in-progress and identify the possible perpetrators goes a long way to stopping this inhumane trade in its tracks. To this end, Freeland's Wildlife Friendly Skies/Seas Program is an awareness training course designed to educate and build capacity of stakeholders and close down these key transit points. Taught by experienced instructors, the course provides students with important knowhow such as:



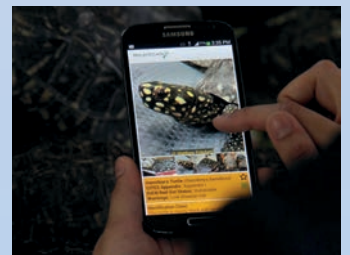
How wildlife traffickers use commercial airlines and shipping services.



How to intercept wildlife crimes and the criminals behind them.



How and where to report suspicious activities.



How to identify protected animals.

Working in collaboration with airports, commercial airlines, local NGO partners, seaports, the shipping industry, and transport sector authorities, Freeland's Wildlife Friendly Skies/Seas Program is helping to create zones free of wildlife trafficking and torture across the globe.
